
PREVENT POISON EXPOSURE

IN CHILDREN

Be on the Lookout for Potential Poisons



- Are extremely dangerous to a child if swallowed!
 Watch for: Remote Controls | Key Fobs & Key Finders | Electronic Toys | Flameless Candles
 - Finders | Electronic Toys | Flameless Candles |
 Flashlights | Calculators | Cameras | Wireless
 Headphones | Vaping Devices | Handheld
 Power Tools
- **Do safety check often:** Ensure battery compartment is secure and closely watch children when items are nearby.

Arts & Crafts

Some arts & craft products contain chemicals.
 Food should not be eaten during use of arts & crafts products. After use, wash children's hands and clean tables, chairs & equipment used.

Medication, Vitamins & Hygiene Items

- Always read labels and follow instructions for children's medications.
- Do Not: take adult medication in front of a child | call medication "candy" or other words that may entice children | keep old medication(s) including unfinished doses.
- Keep vitamins and supplements in upper cabinets
- Watch for: Cosmetics | Cologne | Perfume |
 Body Oil | Mouthwash | Hair Products, Jewelry
 Cleaners | Nail Polish | Nail Polish Remover

Plants & Outdoor Products

- If plants inside and surrounding the home are poisonous, keep out of children's reach.
- Never eat mushrooms, toadstools or berries found outside.
- Do not allow children (or pets) on pesticidetreated lawn for 24 hours.
- Watch for: Weed Killers | Fertilizers | Animal Poison | Pool Chemicals | Gasoline | Kerosine | Turpentine | Antifreeze | Wiper Fluid | Misc. Car Care Products

Carbon Monoxide

 Keep working carbon monoxide detectors close to bedrooms and furnace.







Household Items & Cleaners

- Watch for: Drain & Toilet Bowl Cleaners |
 Dishwashing Soap | Oven Cleaner | Kitchen
 Surface Cleaner | Disinfectants | Ammonia |
 Bleach | Hand Soap & Sanitizer | Window
 Cleaner | Furniture Polish | Laundry Detergent
 | Stain Remover | Air Fresheners (Plug-In Or
 Spray) | Cigarettes | Cigars | Vaping Devices,
 Liquid & Alcohol | Insect Repellant &
 Sunscreen | Paint/Paint Thinner | Mineral
 Spirits
- Disinfectants are not intended for food prep or eating surfaces (ex. kitchen tables or highchairs)
- **NEVER** mix cleaning products (ex. ammonia & bleach) together = poisonous gas.
- · Keep ashtrays empty & clean.

If a child in your care experiences a poisoning – take immediate action:

- Skin contact: Wash area thoroughly with soap and water.
- Eye exposure: Thoroughly rinse for 20 minutes.
- Ingestion/swallowed: Call Poison Help at 1-800-222-1222.
- If a child is unconscious, not breathing, or having convulsions or seizures due to poison contact or ingestion, call 911 or the local emergency number IMMEDIATELY!
